If there is a confirmed medical reason for your child's absence, please notify the school and work will be provided. Thank you for your understanding and patience in this unusual circumstance.







COVID - 19 Update, March 20th 2020.

Dear school community,

Tweed River High School is being proactive in putting in the latest precautionary measures from the Dept of Education and Dept of Health in regards to COVID-19 to support our young people and staff.

I thank you in advance for your patience and support through this difficult time, as I know that some measures will cause inconvenience.

As of Monday, 23rd March, the school has implemented some additional operational guidelines in. They are as follows: -

- Whole school assemblies will be cancelled, along with Term 1 Year assemblies.
- Daily communication will occur during morning roll call so it is important that your children attend school prior to roll call, to be informed of the day's proceedings.
- At this stage, all school excursions and camps have been cancelled until further notice.
- Our Cross Country Carnival and inter-school sporting events have been cancelled, until further notice.
- School sport will be adjusted in order to minimise interactions between students and the general public.
- P&C meetings have been cancelled.
- For now, school based traineeships and apprenticeships, school based VET and EVET course requirements such as workplacements will proceed.
 Students will not be placed in aged care or hospital facilities.

The school has always provided handwash via dispensers in bathrooms and continues to encourage hand washing at more regular intervals. In addition, cleaning staff are taking further precautions in bathrooms and the sanitising of desktops and chair backs along with exam tables when in use, door handles, light and fan switches and computer keyboards are sanitised daily.

Parents and carers, whose child has come down with a respiratory illness are being asked to please not send them to school and arrange care for them. I am asking staff to do the same. If a child falls ill at school, we will be asking parents and carers to collect the child promptly, to avoid any illness spreading at school.

There are no school closures planned, and the school will operate as normal, with these additional guidelines. When I receive updated information, from the Dept of Education and Dept. of Health, I will ensure that you are notified.
