

Stage 6 Assessment Policy and Procedures

A message from the Principal

The NSW Educational Standards Authority (NESA) requires schools to assess performance in Preliminary courses for two main reasons:

- to report a grade to indicate your relative success in the course against a state wide standard;
- to demonstrate satisfactory course completion and therefore eligibility for entry to the HSC course(s) required to complete the HSC Credential.

These assessment summaries satisfy NESA's notification requirements and outline briefly information on:

- the content /outcomes being assessed;
- the method by which they will be assessed; NOTE: some are mandatory assessment components.
- approximately when you will be assessed and the proportion of the final assessment mark (weighting) comes from each of the various components of the course (eg: theory/practical or knowledge/skills/attitudes etc).

In order to satisfactorily complete the Preliminary Courses, the NSW Educational Standards Authority – NESA, requires you to:

- A. Follow the course of study developed or endorsed by the NESA;
- B. Apply yourself with diligence and sustained effort to set tasks and experiences (eg. attend class in order to participate in class activities, excursions, workshops, enrichment days), provided in the course by the school; and
- C. Achieve some or all of the course outcomes;
- D. Maintain regular attendance in classes

At Tweed River High School, the following criteria will be considered in determining satisfaction of these requirements:

You must have a satisfactory record of attendance (90% min.) for scheduled lessons and course experiences – unless you have approved leave, an exemption for illness, misadventure etc.; and You must have made a genuine attempt to satisfactorily complete all assessment tasks in each course including where they are overdue or subject to assessment penalties. This provides the most opportunity for

NOTE: If you do not satisfactorily complete a course it will not be recorded with NESA on your Record of Achievement (RoSA) and you may be ineligible to progress to the HSC Course in that subject. This will

directly impact on you achieving a HSC in the coming year.

you to demonstrate your achievement of some of all course outcomes.

Given the importance of assessment it is imperative that you understand your responsibilities and rights with regard to it. Please read the following information carefully. If you have any questions ask your course teachers, Year Adviser, the Careers Adviser or your Deputy for help.

ASSESSMENT PROCEDURE FAQs

Is there a cover sheet for hand in tasks?

Yes, often handed out when tasks are issued. It is available from staff, the office and on the school website. It must be attached to the front of all hand in tasks submitted for assessment.

When and where are tasks handed in?

All tasks are to be handed in (with completed cover sheet) at the Front Office before 8:20am on the due date.

What must I do to get the best possible assessment mark? Be aware of - and follow - the school's policy on Assessment;

- Be aware of and follow the assessment program and timetable for all of your courses of study be aware of date changes.
- Place the due date for all courses on a calendar you look at regularly OR load them into your phone calendar with notifications to remind you of due dates.
- · Start tasks early
- Ensure all tasks are submitted on time and to a satisfactory standard.
- Check in advance for any assessment tasks that you might miss through a planned absence from school and complete an Illness Misadventure Form prior to leaving and ensure alternative arrangements have been approved and are in place.;
- Upon returning to school after an unplanned absence, check for changes to assessment task details that may have occurred while you were absent;
- Promptly, complete an Illness Misadventure application attaching documentation if a task if missed due to an absence.
- Plan your homework and study program carefully, in order to be prepared for assessment deadlines;
- Try your best in every assessment task
- Back up your work regularly.
- Seek help early from your teacher or the Head Teacher if you are having difficulty or circumstances are impacting on your understanding or ability to complete tasks.

What do I do if I cannot OR I fail to, submit a task on time?

In ALL CASES where a task is not completed and submitted students are to complete an Illness, Misadventure Form in order to be considered for a mark of more than zero. Forms are available from Head Teachers, the office, the Deputy and on the school website.

Where you make application and can provide evidence of a valid reason for requiring extra time, being absent for, or not submitting a task, your course teacher and Head Teacher may:

- approve you to do the task at another time; or
- approve a reasonable extension to the due date; or
- approve you to do an alternative task; or in some exceptional cases
- agree to give you an estimated mark for the task;

Planned Absence:

These include, school representation at fixtures, medical or court appointments, funerals and bereavement. Where you know in advance that you will be absent, advise staff of the details as soon as possible to gain approval for an alternative assessment arrangement if your reason is accepted.

NOTE: Arrangements must be in place prior to your absence. Approval is not given for social events, birthdays etc. Staff will assist you with your application.

Unplanned absence:

Where you are absent due to illness or misadventure or there has been a family crisis; complete an Illness misadventure form and attach:

- a doctor's certificate or documentary evidence of the reason/s you could not attend or submit the task.
- present the paperwork for the absence to your teacher on your first day back at school whether you have class or not.
- if your reason for absence, or non-submission, is not acceptable you
 must be awarded a mark of zero for the assessment task and it will be
 recorded as a non-attempt.

Failing to submit a task:

Students will lose 25%/day for overdue tasks. A ZERO mark will be award on the $5^{\rm th}$ day late without an approved reason.

NB: The task MUST still be completed to a satisfactory standard and submitted in order to meet NESA course completion requirements.

What happens if I can't be at school on the day an out-of-class assessment task is due to be submitted?

If you know in advance that you will not be at school on the due date either submit the task before the due date or make arrangements for a brother/sister/parent/friend on the due date.

If your **absence is unplanned** ... send your task in to school with a brother/sister/parent friend on the due date. If this is not possible, submit it to your teacher or the Head Teacher first thing on your first day back at school, together with the evidence giving reason for your absence. **If you were sick this must be a doctor's certificate.**

If your reason for absence is **acceptable you will not be penalised**. If your reason for absence is **not acceptable** you will be awarded **a mark of zero** and it will be recorded as a **non-attempt**.

What should I do if my preparation for an assessment task is interrupted by illness or some other serious matter?

If you have trouble preparing for an in-class assessment task or in completing an out-of-class assessment task because of illness or some other serious reason then you should discuss your problem with the teacher or Head Teacher before the due date.

The teacher may grant you an extension for an out-of-class assessment task or, for a in-class task, may

- Allow you to do the task at another time; or
- Allow you to do an alternative task; or
- Agree to give you an estimated mark;

If I am having trouble with assessments, who can help me out?

- If you are having trouble understanding the Assessment Policy and Procedures talk to your Year Adviser for assistance. Your Year Adviser will assist you in negotiating a reasonable solution to assessment problems with your teachers. However, you must understand the policy and program and do your best to satisfy them. Assistance can only be given when there are special circumstances to be considered.
- If you are having trouble understanding a task speak with your course teacher or Head teacher for assistance.

Learning support:

Where students require additional support to complete assessments they are to see Learning Support Staff and the Tutors in the library.

Special provisions:

- Students with diagnosed conditions may be eligible for special provisions with NESA.
- The school will support any provisions agreed to by NESA.
- See your Deputy for more information and details of required timeframes.

How much notice will be given of an assessment task?

- You will receive the details of a task in writing a minimum of 2
 weeks prior to the due date so that you can adequately prepare for
 a task. This takes into account the time demands of your other
 school responsibilities and assessment loads.
- Dates may change due to delivery constraints.
- It is the responsibility of students to check the electronic assessment calendar for the latest dates.

What if I think my teacher's assessment decision is unfair?

- If you are concerned about the time you have been given to complete a task or prepare for a task, discuss this with the teacher well before the due date.
- If you disagree with a mark awarded by the teacher, ask the teacher to review the mark. You must do this within 3 days of your teacher giving you the result of the task.
- If you still aren't satisfied you can ask the Head Teacher for a Faculty Review of the task. You must do this within 2 days of your teacher giving you the results of your first appeal.
- If you disagree with a decision of the Head Teacher that your reason for absence was not acceptable you may appeal within 2 days to the Deputy Principal for a further review of the assessment appeal processes.

NB: The decision of the Deputy Principal will be final.

How does the school decide if a course is satisfactorily completed?

- If, by late August the Faculty Head Teacher believes that you have not met the requirements to satisfactorily complete the course she/he will advise the Principal. The Principal will review the evidence provided - including warning letter(s) sent throughout the course, your attendance record and the marks you have gained from assessment tasks and copies of your attempts etc.
- The Principal will review the evidence presented by the teacher and will probably also want to speak with you to discuss the situation.
- The Principal will then make a final decision and advise you, your parent and NESA. You may appeal the decision by providing evidence to the school for consideration. If you are not satisfied with the Principal's final decision you can then appeal to NESA for a review of the school decision.

Assessment Task Cover Sheet

This form is to be attached to the front of every task submitted for marking. Forms are

available on the School website, your teacher when a task is issued and at the Office.



NESA criteria for satisfactory completion of a course

NESA - ACE 4016 - 2012

A student is considered to have satisfactorily completed a course if, in the principal's view, there is <u>sufficient evidence</u> that the student has:

- 1. followed the course developed or endorsed by the Board;
- 2. applied themselves with diligence and sustained effort to the set tasks and experiences (class activities) provided in the course by the school; and
- 3. achieved some or all of the course outcomes.

While the NESA does not set a minimum level of attendance for the satisfactory completion of a course, other than to say **attendance must be regular enough for students to comply with item two above**. DoE Schools across NSW agree 85% is an acceptable minimum attendance rate to ensure success in the HSC.

The Principal may determine that, as a result of absence, the above course completion criteria might not be met. Clearly, such absences are serious and Principals must give students early written warning of the consequences of non-completion of course requirements. The warning must relate the student's absence to the non-completion of the course requirements.

NOTE to STUDENTS and PARENTS:

NESA Warnings will be mailed out to students / parents where breaches of the above requirements occur. The letter will be provided in a timely manner in order to give students time to resolve the matter and meet course requirements before it is too late to do so.

It is the student's responsibility to follow up on and resolve these official warnings in a timely manner – usually 2 weeks.

Where two or more letters are dispatched for breaches in a given course a student's circumstances will be reviewed by the Principal for N Determination in that course.

Where a NESA N Warning Letter is received for a breach of the NESA requirements, students must ensure they do the following to resolve the matter:

- Follow the instructions given in the letter, which may include discussing with the teacher again the requirements of the task and obtaining a copy of the task.
- Complete the work to a satisfactory standard and return it to the course teacher by the deadline indicated in the letter.

NOTE: Work submitted following an N Warning will attract a zero mark but <u>must be completed</u> to the required standard in order to meet course outcomes.

Where a student is "N Determined" in a course for not satisfactorily completing the minimum requirements set out above, the consequences may be that the student is unable to proceed to the next stage of their education – where mandatory requirements are not met; or, they may be placed on a probationary period at the discretion of the Principal. In some circumstances there may be a good case for repeating the particular year of education or undertaking an alternative educational pathway outside of regular schooling.

Mandatory requirements in the following subjects must be completed in order to proceed to the next Stage of education: Language (Japanese @ TRHS), Technology, Music, Visual Arts, PDHPE, English, Mathematics, Science, History and Geography (note: some mandatory requirements can only be completed in Year 7 and/or 8)

The NESA deadline for satisfactory completion of all course requirements is early in Term 3. Do not get caught out.
