I wish our community a safe and joyous Christmas and look forward to working together again in 2019 and to welcoming the class of 2024 into our school community.

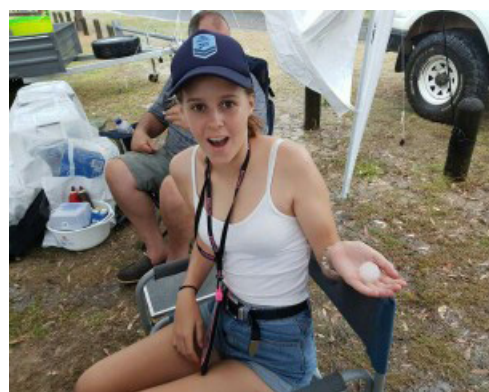
