### Year 12 HSC Trial Examinations

Year 12 Trial HSC Examinations will be taking place in Weeks 4 and 5 of next term. It is imperative that students make valuable use of their time during the holiday break in order to prepare adequately for these exams. Due to NESA's new assessment regime of fewer tasks and examinations, this Trial Examination is more important than ever in preparation for the HSC Examinations.

This is a highly stressful time and it is important that students balance their preparation with personal time and physical activity. The use of study timetables, study groups, accessing the past HSC examination packages via the NESA website are a great way for students to feel confident in their preparedness. Likewise, taking downtime, going for a walk, playing sport and relaxing to break up the intense study is important.

### Year 11 2020 Subject Selection Talks and Information Evening

Head Teachers, or their representatives, have been talking to Year 10 students about subjects offered in their respective faculty for Year 11 study in 2020. Students should be gathering information about different subjects (some of which they may know very little about!), listening carefully to advice and asking questions. They are also encouraged to seek further, more targeted guidance from faculty teachers, senior students, the careers advisor and their parents.

On Monday August 5, Tweed River High School will hold the Year 11, 2020 Information Evening in the SEC from 6.30pm – 8pm. Year 10 students and parents must attend this evening to glean information about the requirements of subject choice and the procedures students need to follow to complete the subject expression of interest process.

Plastic is a petro-chemical product, which means we use crude oil and other chemicals to manufacture it.

3/ Since the 1950s when plastic was developed, around 8.3 billion tons of plastic have been produced worldwide

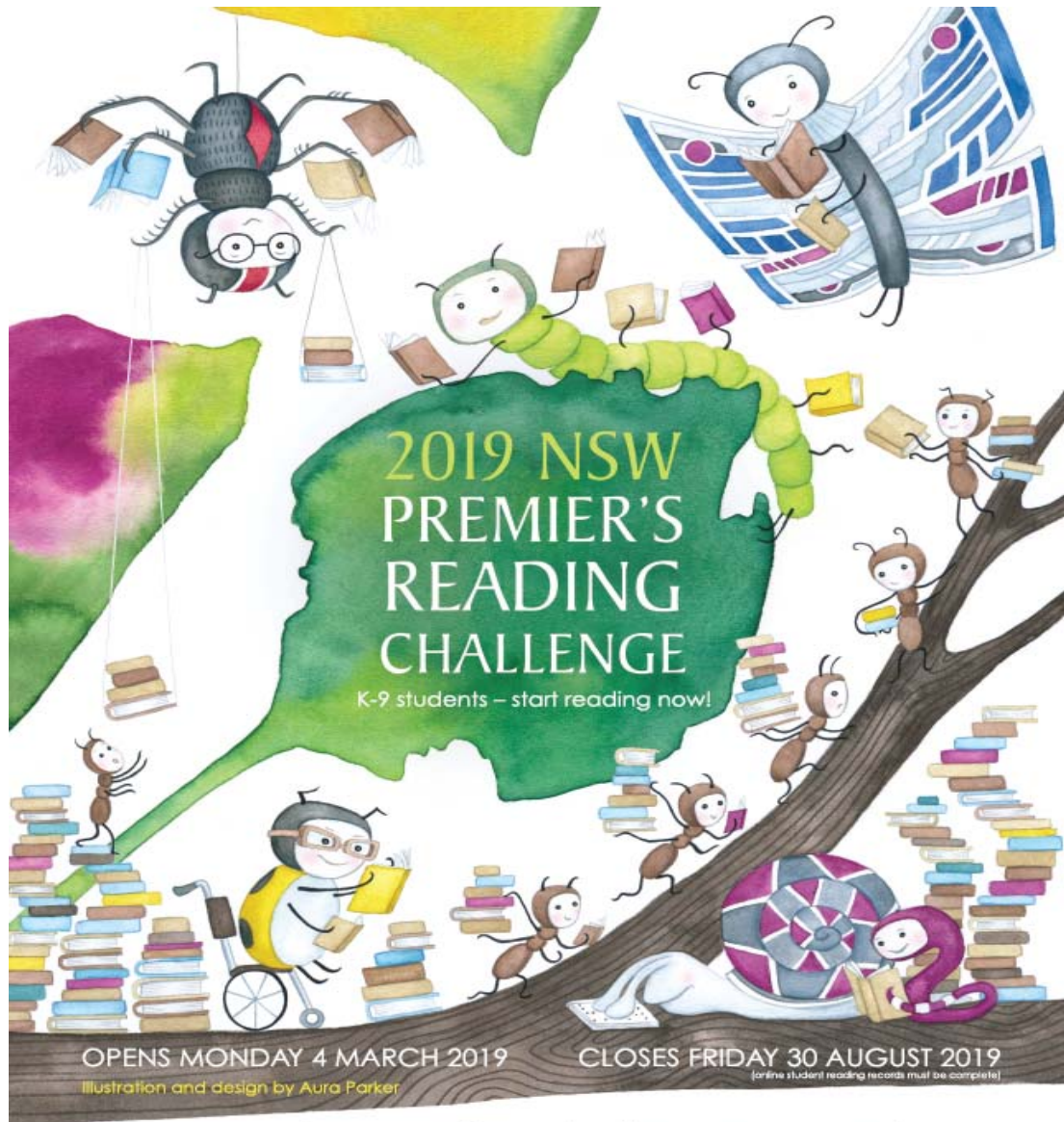

## NATIONALLY CONSISTENT COLLECTION OF DATA

All Government and non-Government schools across Australia are required to participate annually in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). This data collection counts the number of school students receiving an adjustment due to disability and the level of reasonable adjustment they are receiving. The aim of the national data collection is to collect quality information about school students receiving an adjustment due to disability in Australia. This information will help teachers, principals, education authorities and families to better support students with disability to take part in school on the same basis as other students.

### FACT SHEET FOR PARENTS, GUARDIANS AND CARERS

#### WHAT IS THE NCCD?

The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD) takes place every year.

The NCCD is a collection that counts:

- the number of school students receiving an adjustment or 'help' due to disability
- the level of adjustment they are receiving to access education on the same basis as other students.

Students are counted in the NCCD if they receive ongoing adjustments at school due to disability. This 'help' allows them to access education on the same basis as a child without disability. The NCCD uses the definition of disability in the [Disability Discrimination Act 1992](#).

Schools provide this information to education authorities.

Go to *What is a reasonable adjustment?* below to learn about adjustments.

#### WHY IS THIS DATA BEING COLLECTED?

All schools in Australia must collect information about students with disability.

The NCCD:

- ensures that the information collected is transparent, consistent and reliable
- provides better information that improves understanding of students with disability
- allows parents, guardians, carers, teachers, principals, education authorities and government to better support students with disability.

#### Student with disability loading

Funding from the Australian Government for students with disability is based on the NCCD through the student with disability loading.

Students with disability who are counted in the top three levels of the NCCD (extensive, substantial and supplementary) attract the loading. Funding is based on a per-student amount at each of the three levels of additional support. The amount of the loading reflects the level of support students with disability need to participate fully in school, with higher funding for those who need higher levels of support.

Australian Government recurrent school funding is provided as a lump sum to school authorities including state and territory governments, which can then distribute the funding to their member schools according to their own needs-based arrangements.

The Government expects schools and school systems to consider their funding from all sources (ie Australian Government, state and territory and private) and prioritise their spending to meet the educational needs of all of their students, including students with disability. This can include payment of professional learning for staff and building inclusive cultures in schools.

#### WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF THE NCCD FOR STUDENTS?

The information collected by the NCCD helps teachers, principals, education authorities and governments to better support students with disability at school.

The NCCD encourages schools to review their learning and support systems and processes. This helps schools to continually improve education outcomes for all students.

## Compulsory School Attendance

Information for parents

Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. NSW public schools work in partnership with parents to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

### What are my legal responsibilities?

Education in New South Wales is compulsory for all children between the ages of six years and below the minimum school leaving age. The *Education Act 1990* requires that parents ensure their children of compulsory school age are enrolled at, and regularly attend school, or, are registered with the Board of Studies, Teaching and Educational Standards for homeschooling.

Once enrolled, children are required to attend school each day it is open for students.

### The importance of arriving on time

Arriving at school and class on time:

- Ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day
- Helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- Give students time to greet their friends before class
- Reduces classroom disruption

Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and must be explained by parents.

### What if my child has to be away from school?

On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick, or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstance (e.g. attending a funeral)

Following an absence from school you must ensure that within 7 days you provide your child's school with a verbal or written explanation for the absence. However, if the school has not received an explanation from you within 2 days, the school may contact you to discuss the absence.

Principals may decline to accept an explanation that you have provided if they do not believe the absence is in the best interest of your child. In these circumstances your child's absence would be recorded as unjustified. When this happens the principal will discuss their decision with you and the reasons why.

Principals may request medical certificates or other documentation when frequent or long term absences are explained as being due to illness. Principals may also seek parental permission to speak with medical specialists to obtain information to collaboratively develop a health care plan to support your child. If the request is denied, the principal can record the absences as unjustified.

### Travel

Families are encouraged to travel during school holidays. If travel during school term is necessary, discuss this with your child's school principal. An *Application for Extended Leave* may need to be completed. Absences relating to travel will be marked as leave on the roll and therefore contribute to your child's total absences for the year.

In some circumstances students may be eligible to enrol in distance education for travel periods over 50 school days. This should be discussed with your child's school principal.

#### **TWEED YOUTH TO BE HEARD WITH NSW'S FIRST REGIONAL YOUTH TASKFORCE**

Member for Tweed Geoff Provest MP today encouraged young people in Tweed to get in their applications to join NSW's first ever Regional Youth Taskforce which will give youth a chance to have their say on local issues.

Mr Provest said the taskforce will be made up of 18 members who will meet regularly and provide direct advice and feedback to NSW Government agencies and Ministers on policy decisions and local action plans regarding youth.

"To the young people living in Tweed, this is your chance to be heard, to voice your opinion on local issues, to represent your mates and peers and to help make decisions that will drive change in your own community," Mr Provest said.

"Homelessness and mental health are just some of the challenges in our area and will be working to address these with the help of the Taskforce.

"We know each region has different challenges, that's why we are seeking an even representation of two members from each of the nine NSW regions - if you are aged 12 to 24 and have an idea for youth in our community, this is a great time to share it."

Minister for Regional Youth Bronnie Taylor said work is underway to address issues facing young people in regional NSW through multiple initiatives including the \$50 million announced for regional youth through the Stronger Country Communities Fund.

"I am pleased to say the NSW Government has established the first ever Office for Regional Youth and we will soon release the State's first Regional Youth Strategy to address challenges in regional NSW," Mrs Taylor said.

"The young people of today will become the leaders of tomorrow which is why the NSW Government wants to ensure our regional youth are front and centre throughout the decision-making process."

Travel costs and accommodation will be covered for Regional Youth Taskforce members travelling across NSW for meetings.

All NSW school-enrolled children are eligible for **two \$100 Active Kids vouchers**. The vouchers can be used with any approved Active Kids provider, to help cover costs towards registration or membership fees for sport and active recreation. **Voucher one is valid January to December** and **voucher two is valid July to December**. After 1 July 2019, the second voucher can be claimed immediately after the first voucher.
