SENIOR EXECUTIVE REPORT

The end of the year is quickly approaching and planning for 2021 in the challenge of COVID normal is well underway. We appreciate the patience of students, parents and community members as we operate in what appears to be an ever changing environment where at times information and processes can appear to be illogical. Where events have had to be cancelled or heavily modified, somehow we have, for the most part, managed to keep everybody safe and continuing their education.

The HSC is now complete for another year, the Formal was held last week and an enjoyable night was had by all. All that remains is for students to be advised of their results and to implement their "Plan A" or perhaps "Plan B" for 2021. Thankyou to Mr Betts for his effort and support of these students over the past six years. The staff wish them all the very best in their future endeavours as they move into the next stage of their lives.

Orientation Day for our 2021 Year 7 Cohort will be held on December 1st commencing with arrivals at 8:35am. Information regarding the format of the day is currently with local Primary schools and can also be found on our school website and facebook page. Uniforms and payments for various items will be available on the day in the Hall.

Year 7 Camp at Camp GoodEnough is on in the first week of December and there are a lot of excited students and "enthusiastic" staff preparing for that event. It should be a lot of fun after a year that has been so disrupted.

Annual Presentation Day will be going ahead on December 10th. Due to the COVID restrictions it will be run across two sessions on the day and unfortunately parents will again be unable to attend. This year will also see it combine with the Sports Assembly. It is important to acknowledge the achievements of our students across the school in those areas of school life we have been able to engage in this year.

The building program is progressing with four newly expanded and refurbished classrooms in J Block coming on line again next week. These will be followed by a similar number in R block by the end of this year. Just in time for the summer heat classes will be able to forge ahead with their study in the air conditioned learning spaces. Building work will shortly commence to establish a three classroom Support Unit at the school during the first half of 2021. Staff recruitment for that unit is underway. The school will be continuing to develop its facilities over the next couple of years in preparation for the commencement of a VET Hub in the school by 2023 providing expanded opportunities for students to get a great start in a career.

Following a number of incidents at the Coles Express across from the school, parents are asked to not drop and pick up their children from that location or adjacent to it in Minjungbal Drive. The school has concerns for the safety and wellbeing of students walking through the refuelling concourse. Pancake breakfasts continue each Friday B in the quad and the school canteen is available before school and during breaks for students who require food and drinks before classes.

The school timetable is nearing completion thanks to the significant contributions of Messrs Simpson, Topper and Lennox and we are looking forward to a smooth start to 2021.
