### **Attendance**


sent FNC at the North Coast Championship in Port Macquarie.



Our Aboriginal Studies H.S.I.E. teacher, Jan Ryan, received two awards, one as an educator and contributor to furthering Aboriginal Education and outcomes for our Aboriginal students in schools at a local and state level, the with the Tweed Coast and Wollumbin Networks running this event.

Jan received an award for Outstanding Leadership in Aboriginal Education, and the Aboriginal Education Community Award for her outstanding contribution to the Tweed Wollumbin AECG Community, as an associate member of the A.E.C.G.

Two of our Aboriginal students, Charlie Togo, Year 12 and Kayla Maher, Year 10 received awards for their outstanding efforts in artworks.

It was a great night at the Civic Centre which was run by the Tweed Coast and Wollumbin Networks Aboriginal Education.

These are some of Jan Ryan's achievements and contributions:


- In 1991, Jan initiated and taught HSC Aboriginal Studies at Tweed River High School, and actively supported the AEO, Aunty Chris Morgan at the school, A.S.S.P., A.E.C.G.
- Employed to write Junior and Senior Aboriginal Studies syllabi and support materials for schools. Jan has always championed Aboriginal Education. By lecturing at Sydney University conferences, being an Executive member of A.S.A. and sharing teaching resources, she has extended ties between school and the local A.T.S.I. community.
- She was Head Teacher for Aboriginal Student Engagement.
- Jan instigated and supported N.S.W. Far North Coast A.S.A. meetings and the Culturally Nourishing Program at TRHS, linked to N.S.W., Sydney and Griffith universities, educating teachers in including Aboriginal perspectives across all K.L.As, improving outcomes, sense of identity and belonging for Aboriginal students.
- She instigated the A.I.M.E. Program at T.R.H.S. facilitating and collaboratively developing Personal Learning Plans for A.T.S.I. students, improving academic and social wellbeing outcomes.
- Jan coordinated staff for "Titans beyond tomorrow" ensuring A.T.S.I. students completed their H.S.C., continuing into "Beyond Broncos".
- She has instigated and run the Year 8 "Pathways to Booning" and Year10 Geography excursions on country, as well as the Staff introduction to Country, Cherbourg excursions, using her links with A.T.S.I. community members.

All previous nominations will be considered and are invited to update existing submissions.


