



The Year 12 students departed the Gold Coast Airport on Saturday 25th November for the trip of a lifetime to Melbourne along with the Gordonvale Academy from Cairns. Four graduating students attended from the Tweed River Clontarf Academy, they were Kaniya Windley, Benjamin Kennedy, Lachlan Kearney & Tyson Bebbington plus another 6 students from Gordonvale. Students rolled into the airport dressed in full Clontarf uniform and looked the part! Once we arrived in Melbourne we collected our hire vehicle then headed to check in at our Accommodation at the Melbourne Central YHA before heading straight into the City for a bit of shopping and check out our surroundings. Unfortunately, the poor weather hit us right away and Melbourne turned on the rain, wind & cold weather. Ultimately the poor weather meant a number of activities were cancelled and we had to find replacement ones...and that we did.


